Nurse Leader Comrade Mduduzi has been released on bail from Sunnyside Police Station after an urgent bail application was granted. He is scheduled to appear in the Pretoria Central Margistrate Court on Monday. YNITU views the false and baseless charges levelled against its leader as direct attack on its militant and radical Nurse organization.

Cde. Ndlovu's health remains a concern as his rights to basic healthcare were infridged upon throughout this process in the attempt to frustrate and discourage this fearless giant of Nursing Revolution.
